## — CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- Has appeared in 13 postseason games (eight starts), primarily with the Patriots...Played in three Super Bowls (LI, LII, LIII) and won two titles (LI, LIII), all with the Patriots...Started in Super Bowls LII (2/4/18) and LIII (2/3/19)...His 3 strip-sacks in the postseason tie Bills OLB Von Miller for the most among active players
- Appeared in all 17 games (13 starts) as a member of the Chargers in 2022, compiling 46 tackles (30 solo), with 8 TFL, 5 sacks, 3 PD, 1 FF and 2 FRs...Tallied 3 tackles (2 solo) and 1 PD in the AFC Wild Card Playoff at Jax. (1/14/23)...Recorded 1 sack in each of the final five regular season games of the season, which marked the longest streak of his career...Posted 2 solo tackles, 1 sack, 2 TFL and 2 QBHs at Ind. (12/26/22), contributing on a defense that tallied 3 INTs and 7 sacks, while not permitting a third-down conversion

- Returned to the Patriots in 2021, appearing in 16 games (eight starts) with 66 tackles (42 solo), 5 sacks, 2 FFs, 1 FR and 1 INT...Posted 3 tackles (1 solo) in AFC Wild Card Playoff at Buf. (1/15/22)...Matched a season-best 8 tackles (5 solo), while adding 2 sacks and a 35-yard pick-6 in the shutout victory at Atl. (11/18/21)
- In 2020, saw action in 14 games (13 starts) for the Dolphins under his former Patriots linebacker coach Brian Flores...Totaled 69 tackles (46 solo), 6 sacks, 2 FFs, 2 FRs, 6 PD and a career-high 10 TFL...Made 8 tackles (6 solo) and a career-best 3 sacks vs. Cin. (12/6/20), earning AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the second time in his career...Tallied a season-high 9 tackles (5 solo), adding 2 PD and a 28-yard FR return to the 1-yard line in the win vs. LAR (11/1/20)
- Played and started in 15 games for the Patriots in 2019, tallying 56 tackles (41 solo) and career highs in sacks (6.5) and FFs (3) as part of a unit that ranked the No. 1 overall defense (275.9 ypg) and scoring defense (14.1 ppg)...Registered 5 tackles (4 solo) and 1 FF on a sack in the AFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Ten. (1/4/20)...Scored a TD on a 22-yard FR return following LB Jamie Collins' FF vs. NYG (10/10/19)...Named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his 8-tackle, 2-sack, 2-FF performance at Buf. (9/29/19)
- Started all 16 games for the Super Bowl Champ Patriots in 2018, registering a career-high 89 tackles (54 solo), 5 TFL, 3.5 sacks, 1 FF, 2 FRs and 1 INT while reaching the end zone twice – once following a blocked punt and once on a FR...Started all three postseason games, registered a team-high 17 tackles (15 solo) and 3 sacks...Started in the Super Bowl LIII victory vs. LAR (2/3/19), posting 3 total tackles and 1 sack as part of a defensive effort that held the Rams' top-ranked offense to just 3 points...Finished with a team-best 10 tackles (8 solo) and 2 sacks in the AFC Championship Game at KC (1/20/19)...Returned a fumble 46 yards for a TD in the third quarter of the victory vs. NYJ (12/30/18)...Tallied a single-game career-high 12 tackles (5 solo) at Ten. (11/11/18)...Totaled 8 tackles (7 solo), 2 sacks, and 1 FF at Buf. (10/29/18)...Scored his first-career TD on a 29-yard return following a blocked punt at Chi. (10/21/18)

- Played in 13 games (12 starts) for the Super Bowl-bound Patriots in 2017, racking up 73 tackles (58 solo), 7 TFL, 5.5 sacks (second on the team), 9 QBHs and 2 PD...Started all three postseason games, including Super Bowl LII vs. Phi. (2/4/18), where he finished with 5 tackles (4 solo) and 1 TFL...Made a team-high 9 tackles (5 solo) in the AFC Championship Playoff vs. Jax. (1/21/18), including a 9-yard sack which halted the Jaguar's fourth-quarter potential game-winning drive...Registered the first multi-sack game of his career, posting 2 sacks and totaling 7 tackles (6 solo), at NYJ (10/15/17)...Collected a season-high 11 tackles (9 solo) vs. Hou. (9/24/17)
- Was traded from the Lions to the Patriots midway through the 2016 season...Played in all three of New England's postseason games, including their Super Bowl LI victory vs. Atl. (2/5/17)...Split a sack with DE Trey Flowers on a third-quarter third-and-11, helping spark the largest comeback in Super Bowl history...Finished with four total tackles and 1 FF in AFC Championship win vs. Pit. (1/22/17)...Picked off QB Jared Goff for his first-career INT in a win vs. LAR (12/4/16)
- Appeared in 30 games (seven starts) for the Lions from 2014-16, primarily playing on special teams...Totaled 34 tackles (30 solo), 3 TFL and 1 sack on defense...Notched 7 total tackles at Chi. (10/2/16)...Made his first-career start in the Lions' season-opening win at Ind. (9/11/16)...Registered his first-career sack vs. Min. (10/25/15)...Made his postseason debut in the NFC Wild Card Playoff at Dal. (1/4/15)...Posted 1 solo tackle in his NFL debut vs. Mia. (11/9/14)

### — PERSONAL —

- Ended his four-year career at BYU (2010-13) as one of the program's most decorated defensive players of all-time...Appeared in 52 games (36 starts) for the Cougars, registering 226 tackles (157 solo), 61.5 TFL (most in program history), 25 sacks, 5 FFs, 4 FRs, 7 INTs and 3 blocked kicks...Was a two-time (2012-13) All-America and three-time (2011-13) first-team All-Independent performer...Was named the All-Independent Defensive Player of the Year and a semifinalist for the Bednarik and Butkus Awards (best defensive player and best LB, respectively) after recording 17.5 TFL in 2013...Ranked seventh in the nation with 13 sacks as a junior for the nation's No. 3-ranked total defense in 2012...Exploded in the Poinsettia Bowl against San Diego State (12/20/12), posting a Defensive MVP performance that included 8 tackles (5 solo), 3.5 TFL, 1 blocked punt, 1 strip-sack, 1 FR-TD and 1 pick-6...Was the only FBS player in 2011 to record at least 1 tackle, TFL, sack, INT, PD, FR, FF, blocked kick and TD...Recorded a strip-sack and scored on the FR return in the win against Ole Miss (9/3/11)
- Graduated from BYU with a degree in history and minor in communications in 2013
- Played OLB and WR at McQueen (Reno, NV) HS, where he received over 25 scholarship offers as the most highly-recruited player in Northern Nevada history...Led the Lancers to a 14-0 record and a 4A state championship in 2008, while earning first-team All-State honors...Tallied 79 tackles, 14 sacks and 6 FFs, along with 35 receptions for 731 yards and 18 TDs as a senior...As a junior, recorded 69 tackles, 24 TFL, 7 sacks and 7 FFs, while totaling 805 receiving yards and 13 TDs...Also lettered in basketball, baseball and track, where he was an all-league performer in the 4x100, 4x200 and 4x400 relays...Inducted into McQueen's Athletic Hall of Fame in August of 2023
- Believes he will work in broadcasting when his football career ends...Worked as an analyst for NFL Network during the run up to Super Bowl LVII in February 2023
- Enjoys playing golf in his free time...Played Augusta National Golf Club practice course during the week of the 2022 Masters PGA Tournament
- Married his college sweetheart, former Miss Utah Marissa Powell, in 2014...Has one son (Trae) and one daughter (Giavanna)
- The story of his recruitment to BYU was featured in Jeff Benedict & Armen Keteyian's best-selling book, "The System"
- Mentored former Detroit Lions first-round pick DE Ziggy Ansah while they were teammates at BYU, teaching him how to play football and train after walking onto the team from Ghana and never playing the sport before...Later became NFL teammates in Detroit
- Wore leg braces for the first two years of his life, at one point breaking off part of his brace to climb out of his crib
- Learned the phrase, "RMA – right mental attitude" from his high school coach Ken Dalton...Lives by that mantra and has passed it down to his children
- Close friends with former NBA player Brandon Davies, who played on the BYU basketball team when Van Noy was a student
- Grew up a fan of the Nevada Wolf Pack, frequently attending the university's football, basketball and baseball games
- Started playing football at 5 years old, when his father, who worked in parks and recreation, would sneak him into a flag football league with 8-year-olds...Started playing tackle football at age 9
- Was given the name Kyle by his adopted parents Layne and Kelly Van Noy, who adopted him a few months after he was born...His biological mother – who remains anonymous – put him up for closed adoption with the request that he be raised a Mormon...Raised in California for the first decade of his life after being born in Henderson, NV, and moving to Reno, NV, at age 11...Also has an older brother, Travis

- He and his wife Marissa created the Van Noy Valor Foundation in 2014, with the mission to provide opportunities and encouragement for personal valor in disadvantaged youth by granting resources and tools to grow and develop and teaching the youth to armor themselves for future success... Inspiration for the foundation came from their love of helping adopted, fostered and disadvantaged youth in need, Kyle himself, as well as Melissa's father and brother, were adopted... Has provided internship and scholarship opportunities for children involved with the foundation... Has hosted many events, including a charity golf outing and backpack giveaways for school-aged children... Took 53 children and adults from Koinonia Foster Homes & Family Services to the Reno Aces vs. Las Vegas 51s minor league baseball game, where Kyle threw out the first pitch

## — 2023 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS —

- Saw time in 14 games (four starts) during his first season as a Raven, setting a career-high in sacks (9), while posting 30 tackles, 9 TFL, 4 PD, 2 FFs and 9 QBHs... Helped the Ravens' defense become the first unit in NFL history to lead the league in scoring (16.5), sacks (60) and takeaways (31)
- Notched 3 tackles (2 solo), including 1 TFL, and 1 QBH in the AFC Championship vs. KC (1/28/24), helping hold the Chiefs to just 98 total yards and zero points in the second half
- Registered 2 total tackles, including a second-quarter sack-fumble (-3 yards), vs. Pit. (1/6), contributing to a franchise-tying 4 FFs in a single game (10/18/20 at Phi.) since at least 2000 (when data became available)
- Registered 1 sack (-5 yards), setting a new single-season career-high (8), in the 56-19 vs. Mia. (12/31)... Baltimore's defense posted 3 takeaways, 3 sacks and limited the Dolphins' No. 1 scoring offense to just 19 points

- Recorded 3 tackles (1 solo), including 1 sack (-5 yards), in the 33-19 victory at SF (12/25), contributing to a 4-sack effort by a Ravens' defense that also forced a season-best 5 turnovers (all INTs)
- Contributed 4 tackles (3 solo), including 2 TFL, and 1 PD in the 37-31 OT victory vs. LAR (12/10)... His third-quarter TFL helped the Ravens tie the franchise single-game record (6) for most TFLs in a quarter (10/26/17 vs. Mia.)
- Posted 2 tackles (1 solo), including 1 sack (-10 yards), in the 34-20 win vs. Cin. (11/16), helping the defense register 5 sacks and hold the Bengals to 2-of-11 (18.2%) on third down
- Notched 2 sacks (-21 yards), one of which a strip-sack (recovered by DT Broderick Washington), on back-to-back plays in the second quarter in the 37-3 win vs. Sea. (11/5)... Baltimore's defense permitted season-lows in total yards (151), rushing yards (28), first downs (six) and third-down conversions (1-of-12, 8.3%)
- Registered 5 tackles (2 solo) and 2 sacks (-13 yards) in the 38-6 win vs. Det. (10/22)... Baltimore's 5 sacks tied a franchise record (set in 2006) of three straight home games reaching that mark
- Posted his first sack as a Raven (-9 yards) and 1 PD in the 24-16 win at Ten. (10/15 in London)... Baltimore's defense totaled a season-high 6 sacks while permitting a season-low 1-of-9 (11.1%) on third down
- Recorded 1 QBH and 1 PD in his Ravens debut, contributing to a defense that allowed just 166 total yards (93 rushing and 73 passing) in the 28-3 win at Cle. (10/1)... It marked the Ravens' fewest yards allowed since 12/2/18 at Atl. (131 yards)
